The position will focus on providing youth support, coordination of recreation programs and operation and maintenance of the Youth Centre. You will be familiar with Eagle Lake First Nation governance sectors and local services available that offer solutions to youth experiencing distress and support for healthy living patterns. Community culture, customs and traditions are integrated into all your program offerings, and you are mindful of the importance of respect, professionalism, and excellence as you carry out your duties.

- Champions the importance of youth in shaping a healthy, vibrant, and prosperous community.
- Can support the design, planning, organization and implementation of programs, activities, and events in addition to tracking, reporting, and evaluating the same.
- Understands the regional labour market and sees the opportunities and challenges related to training, employment and retention issues while providing guidance and mentorship around resumes, cover letters, job search skills.
- Is dedicated to personal growth and can organize offerings of certified training for youth, i.e., First Aid, Babysitting & Safety Courses and WHIMIS and has skills related to education & career mapping and life skill development.
