JOB DESCRIPTION

The Health, Safety, and Environmental Manager is a full-time position that reports to the Chief Executive Officer. They will work collaboratively within a team environment and perform a key role ensuring responsible development of the project, including the protection of land, waters and traditional way of life for partner First Nations. The position will be responsible for, but not limited to, managing and implementing environmental programs, conducting site assessments, analyzing data, and ensuring compliance with regulations.

General responsibilities;

- Monitor environmental conditions and potential impacts during construction.
- Conduct site inspections to ensure environmental compliance.
- Participate in environmental monitoring and reporting activities.
- Coordinate with contractors to minimize environmental impacts and resolve issues.
- Develop and implement environmental policies and programs.
- Conduct environmental assessments and risk analyses.
- Monitor and track environmental compliance with regulations.

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in Environmental Science, Environmental Engineering, or a related field
- At least 4 years of experience in a similar role, with a focus on Indigenous Participation throughout the life of an economic development project.
- Knowledge of the economic, social, and political environment of Northwestern Ontario and/or Knowledge of the Manito Aki Inakonigaawin principles is considered an asset.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills in English; the ability to communicate verbally in the Indigenous languages spoken in Northwestern Ontario is considered an asset.
- Strong administrative skills with a focus on document control and record-keeping
- Ability to pay close attention to detail and ensure data entry accuracy
- Time management skills and the ability to handle multiple tasks simultaneously
- Valid Class "G" license
